# 2024 Greater Raritan Job Fair set to feature 80-plus exhibitors

Employer and community registration is available for the Greater Raritan 2024 Job Fair being presented at the Hindu Temple and Cultural Society on Route 202-206 in Bridgewater from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesday, June 4.

This third annual event is presented by The Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board and the New Jersey Department of Labor & Workforce Development in collaboration with the temple. Employers in Hunterdon and Somerset Counties as well as surrounding counties are invited to take part to connect their open positions with the hundreds of job seekers who will be in attendance. The job fair, which has attracted 350-plus job seekers annually, is free for employers and job seekers to attend.



The event also will feature information on career resources, and a job seeker workshop presented by Jan Goodman, Community the Outreach Specialist for the Greater Raritan One-Stop Career Training Center.

Each business/agency registrant will be given an assigned table and two chairs. Employer registration will close on Monday, May 20. Prior to the event, employers will received a map showing the location of their tables and details about the event.



#### Workforce Resources Help Residents Achieve Diplomas, Career Goals

Residents of Somerset and Hunterdon counties who want to complete their high school diploma or further their personal career goals can use different programs available through the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board (GRWDB) and its partners.

The Workforce Learning Link, with locations in Flemington and Somerville, provides free assistance to eligible New Jersey residents 16 years of age and older who are not enrolled in school and are legally able to work in the U.S. Program participants can:

• Get assistance with high school diploma attainment, including help with studying and testing.

In addition, at 10:30 a.m. Goodman will present a workshop on Multiple Natures, which is a career discovery, job transition, recruitment and life coaching assessment tool. Each person has a unique set of traits which provides a predisposition towards different types of work and activities. Multiple Natures is designed to assist individuals in their quest for self-inprovement and finding the flow to fulfill their true potential.

### The GRWDB brings Resources to Community

The new year brought a new title and expanded responsibilities to Jeanne Cassano who started with the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board (GRWDB) in the fall of 2019 as the staff job

Cassano, a Hunterdon County resident, is now the **GRWDB Contract Compliance and Engagement** Specialist. In this role, she led the contract monitoring process for the different vendors supplying programmatic support for GRWDB-funded services in Hunterdon and Somerset Counties. These reports were shared with the GRWDB Board during its April 3 meeting, and can be viewed here.

She also was out and about in the community, representing Local Area workforce services at events, including at Assemblyman's Joe Danielsen's Free Job Fair Franklin. on April 24

These events gave Cassano the opportunity to talk with employers and young job seekers about the GRWDB's many programs, including the 2024 Summer Youth Work Experience Program, which this years runs for May 14 to Oct. 30. Cassano, who has been the coordinator of the summer program for five years, was able to talk with new employer and youth candidates who hadn't previously been involved with the program.

The GRWDB has received \$297,248 from the New Jersey Department of Labor which will fund 80 positions in businesses around the county. This year, participants will receive \$3,200 for 200 hours of work experience. In addition, Somerset County is supporting at least 10 additional positions using American Rescue Plan funding. Right now Cassano is working with the new part-time SYWEP Navigator Wankeith Akin (a previous program participant) on the matching process, so the youth participants can start in June. ## GRWDB National Youth Apprenticeship Event draws hundreds

In recognition of the first Youth Apprenticeship Week, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor, the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board (GRWDB) hosted a free YAW Career Event on Monday, May 6, at Raritan Valley Community College in Branchburg.

Nearly 30 state, county and local businesses, agencies provided apprenticeship opportunities, career information and networking opportunities to more than 130 youth, parents and community members who wanted to learn about different apprenticeship-related career pathways. Among those on hand was Hunterdon County Commissioner Director Jeff Kuhl, who presented a proclamation about the event and the new national week.

"I want to thank members of the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board for organizing this event for students in middle school, high school, and college, as well as recent graduates, to gain a better understanding of the importance of career planning. This is a great venue for attendees to network, meet, and talk with agencies looking to recruit new employees for their organizations," Kuhl said. "Additionally, apprenticeship programs provide ... a path for any qualified individuals to contribute to America's growing industries."

County supported this workforce Somerset also Somerset development effort. County Board Deputy Director Sara Commissioners Sooy presented proclamation about the event to GRWDB Director Paul Grzella during the Board's April 23 meeting.

The free event included a series of short presentations from different businesses and agencies about the benefits of learning an occupation through the apprenticeship model. A plumber and educator spoke along with representatives from Hunterdon County Polytech and Somerset County Vocational and Technical High School. In addition, a light meal was available, courtesy of ShopRite of Hunterdon County. The U.S. Department of Labor Office of Apprenticeship also was in attendance, offering information to businesses and job seekers about the value of the apprenticeship career pathway model.

The goal of the event was to build connections, and as they left, many job seekers, students and parents said they took away a lot of information and ideas.

Ryan Roberts, director of Human Resources for Magna Power in Flemington, said that "a couple of students came to my table stating they were there specifically to speak to me about electronics assembly as a career. One

student knows a current employee who came from Somerset County Vo-Tech High School and is looking to start a Co-Op come the Fall. I also made a connection Hunterdon Vo-Tech that is looking to have me speak with adult learner students. So, it's always good to get out there and make connections."

Youth Apprenticeship Week is a new nationwide celebration that highlights the benefits and value of registered apprenticeship program opportunities for youth.



First Steps Basic English began in the fall of 2023 with \$150,000 in American Rescue Plan funding from the Somerset County Board of Commissioners. A collaboration led by the the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board working with the Literacy Volunteers of Somerset County, the Hunterdon County Educational Services Commission and Raritan Valley Community College, it has served 156 English-language learners thus far. - Enhance their basic literacy and computer skills to obtain or maintain work.

Learning Link program participants also can be connected to a variety of career-related training and workforce-readiness programs available through the GRWDB and its partners.

Residents who have a recent "Green" GED Ready Score and need a site to take the Online GED TEST can now make an appointment to take their test in a quiet, private space using computers supplied by the GRWDB and its partners.

The testing sites are connected to the Workforce Learning Link locations in Somerset and Hunterdon Counties and are available by appointment from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday. The locations are at 8 Bartles Corner Road, Suite 205, Flemington, in Hunterdon County and in at 27 Warren St., second floor, Somerville, in Somerset County.

The new GED community testing initiative is supported by the GRWDB, which provided funding in 2023 for the purchase of a new testing computer in Flemington. In Somerville, the computers were upgraded using other GRWDB funding.
