Client from One-Stop Career Training Services Center

Client walked into the One Stop Career Training Services Center seeking the assistance of the Community Outreach Specialist's skills in resume review and interview preparation. She had a wealth of knowledge and expertise in the real estate industry, working for many years as an independent concierge with licenses in real estate, title insurance and mortgages. She also had a very lucrative career with high earnings as a top producer with numerous performance awards. As the real estate industry slowed with little inventory on the market couple with the rise in interest rates, interest rates, client's business took a significant hit. She was in fear of meeting her financial obligations and concerned about losing her concierge status and three licenses. To make ends meet, she rented out her own home for income.



After several months of very focused coaching, client was able to land a job with a major financial institution working in its training and development division providing regional support to its employees. Client noted that the new perspective given to her provided her with the opportunity to find stable and sustainable employment outside the real estate industry.



Greater Raritan One-Stop Success Story #2


Client from Department of Vocational Rehabilitation Services

Client came to DVRS in high school seeking tuition assistance for College. She required their assistance due to her Specific Learning Disability. She chose to attend a University in Florida to earn a Bachelor's Degree in Communications Sciences and Disorders. She earned her Bachelor's Degree in Communications Sciences and Disorders with honors, and then went on to earn a master's degree in Speech Language Pathology. She graduated in with a cumulative GPA of 3.79. She had to do an internship and then work under a mentor. She was hired by a public school where she finished her clinical fellowship with them and worked as a leave replacement for the 2022-2023 school year, and worked as a full time employee for the 2023-2024 school year. She will be returning there in the fall of 2024. This was all made possible through client's hard work and persistence to overcome her barriers, along with the assistance of DVRS.
